Rear Admiral Roy Nash

1975 Graduate



Rear Admiral Roy Nash served as an Officer in the United States Coast Guard for 34 years, promoted to the rank of 2 star Admiral in 2010. He protected US ports and mariners at sea through advancement of maritime safety standards, search and rescue operations, and environmental stewardship.

In 2010, he led 47,000 first responders conducting oil spill removal operations pursuant to the Deepwater Horizon disaster in the Gulf of Mexico. RADM Nash received numerous service medals over his career, including the Legion of Merit (4), and the Distinguished Service Medal.

Ambassador Pierre Richard Prosper



Ambassador Pierre Richard Prosper served as the United States Ambassador-at-Large for War Crimes Issues from 2001 to 2005. As one of the President's envoys and senior diplomats, Ambassador Prosper conducted diplomatic negotiations with heads of states and senior government officials from over 60 countries and visited conflict zones to secure peace, stability, and the rule of law. He also played a key role in developing policy to confront terrorism. From 1996 to late 1998, he prosecuted the first ever case of genocide under the 1948 Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide and broke new ground in international law by convincing the United Nations tribunal to recognize rape committed in a time of conflict as an act of genocide and a crime against humanity.
